PROFILE OF THE DISTRICT

The Birim North District was established in 1987 out of the Former Birim District Council as part of the government's decentralization program, with L.I 1422,

It aimed at promoting effective decentralized governance and accelerating development in the area.

Within our jurisdiction, there are 78 settlements. The district shares its boundaries with the Kwahu West Municipal to the North, Akyemansa District to the South, Atiwa East District and Kwaebibiriem Municipal to the East, and Asante Akyem South and Adansi South District, both situated in the Ashanti Region, to the West.

POPULATION GROWTH

As per the 2021 National Population and Housing Census (PHC), the District's population was reported at 82,669 made up of 41,343 males (50.01%), slightly exceeding the female population of 41,326 (49.99%).

This represents 2.8 percent of the region's total population.

ECONOMIC POTENTIAL OF THE DISTRICT

The Birim North District is primarily agrarian, with approximately 73.5 percent of the total labor force engaged in agriculture and its associated activities.

The primary crops cultivated include staples such as maize, cassava, cocoyam, taro, plantains, and various vegetables.

Also, tree crops, including cocoa, rubber, citrus, and oil palm, with oil palm being a prominent crop cultivated on a large scale.

Economic activities within the District encompass primary (crop) production, animal husbandry, small-scale industrial operations, mining, and commerce.

The District benefits from its strategic location and a rapidly growing population, making it one of the most dynamically expanding and vibrant commercial Districts in the region.

Beyond serving as a robust marketing center for neighboring Districts, it plays a pivotal role in the marketing of goods originating from Kade, Nkawkaw, and Akim Oda.

HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY

The District offers a variety of accommodation options, including three four-star hotels: Obaa's Golden Plaza (Afosu), Miners Inn (New Abirem), Beige Village Golf Resort and Spa (Afosu), and Candlelight Hotel and Restaurant (Afosu), Paradis Hotel (Nyafoman).

There are seven guesthouses located throughout the district: Ma Home (Afosu), Royal Hill (New Abirem), Righteous (New Abirem), Naagyei (Afosu), Ofori (Afosu), Manna Lodge (Akoase), Nketia (Akoase), and Amadu Guest House in Akoase.

NATURAL RESOURCE ENDOWMENT

A variety of minerals are found within the District, with gold being the most prominent mineral deposit. Gold is present in both rock formations and alluvial deposits

A team of officers from the Assembly comprising of the District Development Planning Officer (DPO), District Works Engineer (DWE), the Head of Social Welfare and Community Development Officer, officers from the Information Services Department, some Assembly members and Elders from selected communities where the sites were located visited the following sites.

Confluence of Abenasuo and River Pra (Two Joint Rivers)
Waterfalls at Adjendua
Three headed Palm Tree at Akrofonso

The Pra River, a major water course in the region, flows through the District whiles Abenasuo River runs adjacent to it.

These two rivers have been found to converge at Praso Kuma creating a significant confluence.

The confluence the River Pra and Asuaobena at Praso Kuma holds great ecological importance.

The discovery of the Pra-Abenasuo river confluence enrich our understanding of the regions hydrological network, mapping and maintaining this confluence can aid in effective water management and land-use planning.

The confluence has the potential to stimulate socio-economic development in the District.
